Here are just a few of those incredible women.



HARRIET TUBMAN

1850'S

Tubman was a prominent figure in the abolitionist movement and an Underground Railroad conductor who helped many enslaved people escape to freedom.



SUSAN B. ANTHONY

1870'S

Anthony was a key figure in the women's suffrage movement in the United States. Her advocacy and tireless efforts contributed significantly to women gaining the right to vote.



ROSA PARKS

1940'S

Parks is known as the "Mother of the Civil Rights Movement" for her refusal to give up her bus seat to a white passenger, sparking the Montgomery Bus Boycott and advancing the fight for civil rights.



FLORENCE NIGHTINGALE

1860'S

Known as the founder of modern nursing, Nightingale revolutionized healthcare practices during the Crimean War and laid the foundation for modern nursing education.



AMELIA EARHART

1930'S

A pioneering aviator who became the first woman to fly solo across the Atlantic Ocean. Earhart's accomplishments in aviation inspired women around the world.



RUTH BADER GINSBURG

1990'S - 2020'S

Ruth Bader Ginsburg, also known as RBG, was a groundbreaking Supreme Court Justice who championed gender equality and women's rights throughout her legal career.
